Dear Resident and/or Business Operator,

Re: Night Time Road Works – Foreshore Road

The design and construction for the Port Botany Container Terminal Expansion is being carried out under deed to Sydney Ports Corporation by Baulderstone Hornibrook Jan de Nul (BH-JDN) Consortium. Construction is due for completion in March 2011.

As part of the ongoing works for the construction of the three new intersections on Foreshore Road located at Mill Stream look out, the new boat ramp and the new terminal access road, night work has been scheduled to occur in May and June 2009

Night work involving the installation of concrete barriers, light pole footings, conduits and a water main will occur along Foreshore Road, from the week commencing **Monday 18 May 2009**. This work will take up to **13 nights** over a **three week period**, weather permitting. Works will occur between Mondays and Fridays from 8.00pm to 5.30am.

There may be some noise associated with the use of excavators, cranes compactors and from the reversing beepers of trucks.

During these works there will be some temporary lane closures, and the speed limit will be reduced to 40km/h while this work is completed. Traffic control measures and advisory signage will be in place to assist motorists through the work areas.

Once the works are completed the current number of lanes will remain open in each direction.

You will be notified again for further night works along Foreshore Road scheduled to take place in June 2009.
