Dear Resident and/or Business Operator,

Re: Pavement Repairs on Foreshore Road

The design and construction for the Port Botany Container Terminal Expansion is being carried out under deed to Sydney Ports Corporation by Baulderstone Jan de Nul Consortium. The Project is due for completion in March 2011.

As part of these works repairs to the traffic pavement are required on Foreshore Road at the intersection to the public boat ramp. This will require a temporary work site to be created within the median strip / intersection area.

Works are expected to start from Monday 31 May 2010 and will take about 4 weeks to complete (subject to weather conditions). This work will take place during standard working hours of Monday to Friday, from 7am to 6pm, and Saturday from 8am to 1pm.

During these works traffic will not be able to turn right into the public boat ramp when travelling east bound on Foreshore Road. A temporary road diversion will be in place via the Penrhyn Road roundabout. Traffic control measures and advisory signage will be in place to assist motorists through and around the work area. Once the works are completed, access to the public boat ramp when travelling east bound along Foreshore Road will be reinstated.

Minimal night works will occur as part of this activity for the installation of temporary concrete barriers and erection of signage for the work zone. This will take one shift at the commencement and completion of the overall works. It is not anticipated that this work will be audible to local residents.
