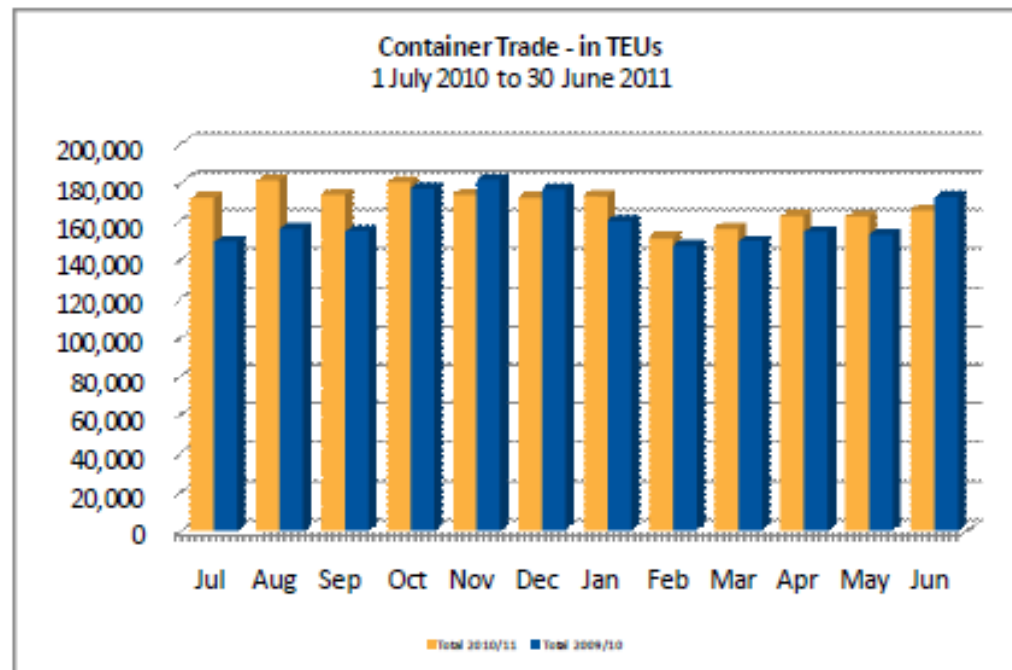

# Total Container Trade 2010/11

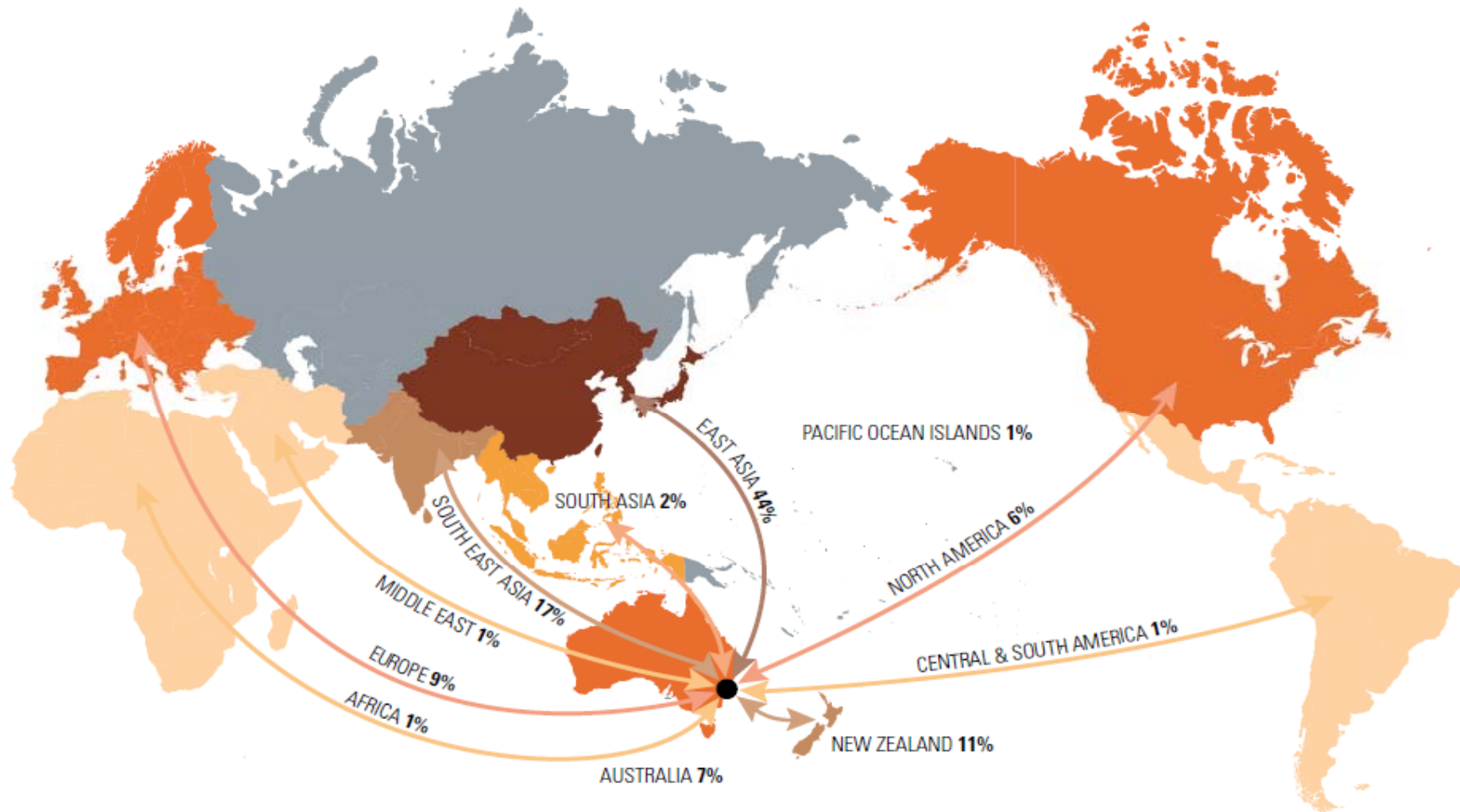
- Sydney Ports breaks the 2.0 million TEUs mark for the first time.
- Total throughput reaches 2,020,086 TEUs.
- Container trade is up 4.8% when compared to 2009/10 FY.
- 2010/11 is the Tenth Annual throughput record for Sydney Ports.
- Full imports are up 5.2% when compared to last year reaching 1,000,450 TEU.
- Full exports are up 3.6% compared with 2009/10 reaching 458,700 TEU.
- Empty exports increased 6.3% when compared to 2009/10.

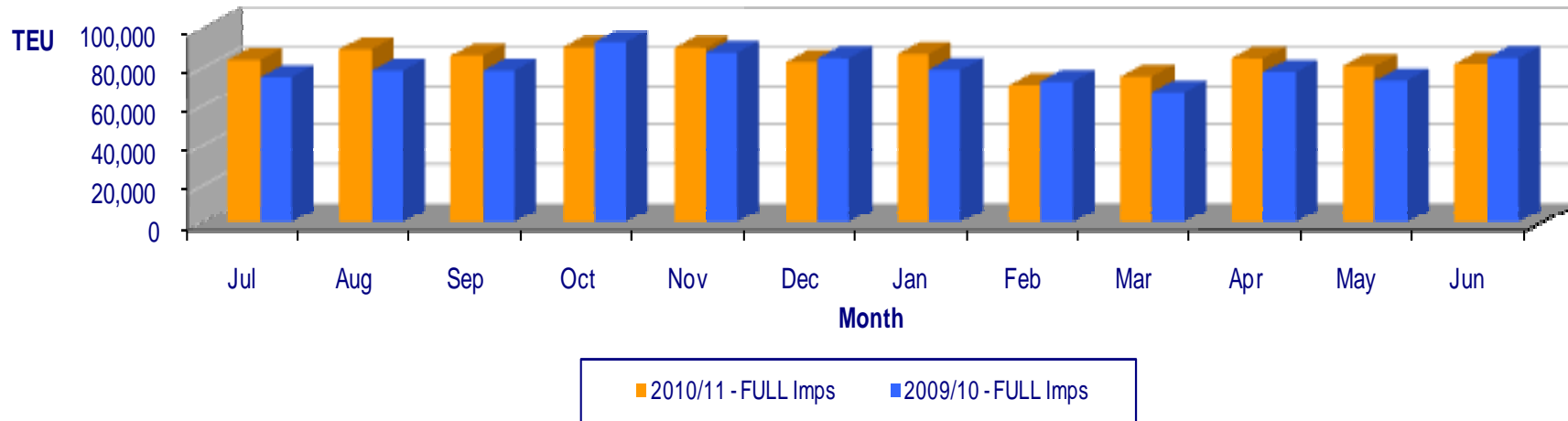

# Full Container Imports – by Commodity

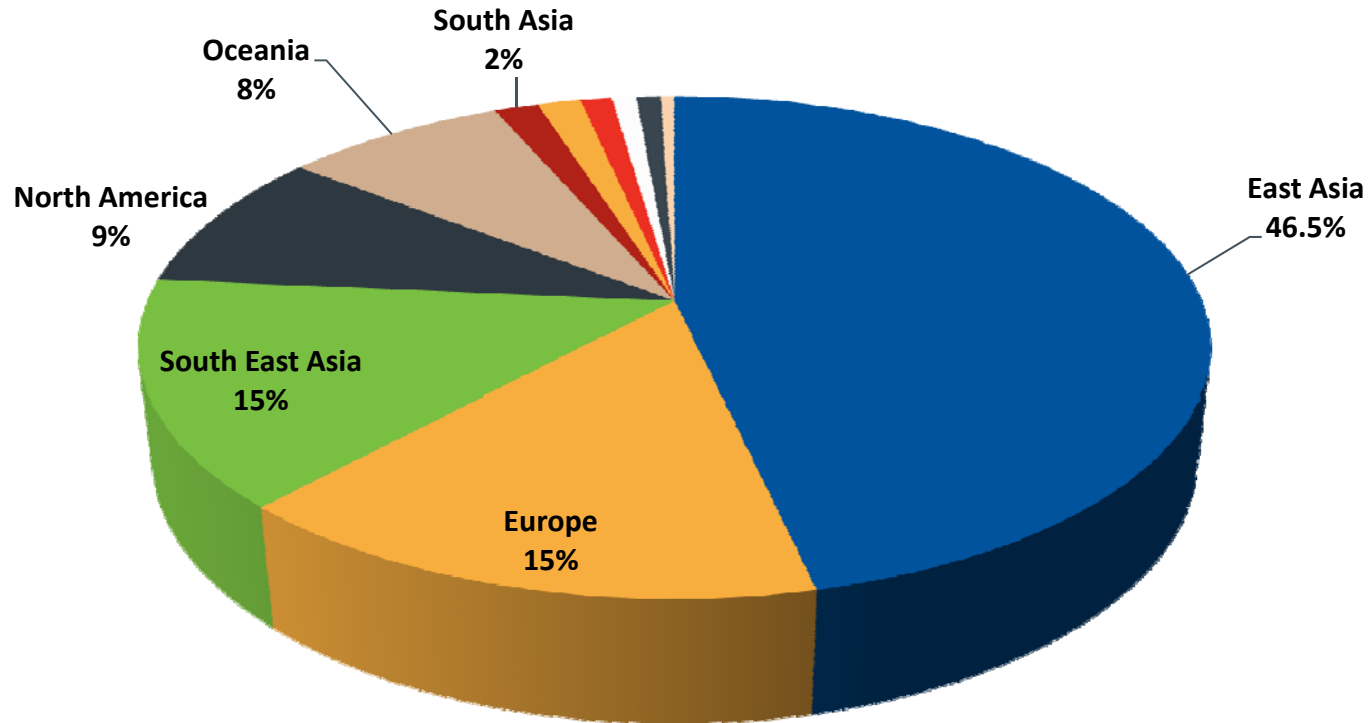
- Total full imports for 2010/11 financial year rose by 5.2% reaching over 1,000,450 TEUs

## Key drivers of growth were:

- Miscellaneous manufactures was up 9% when compared to last year which includes furniture, clothing accessories and a large variety of consumer products.
- Chemicals were up 7% to 2009/10, which includes plastic materials, resins, cleaning materials and perfumes. Machinery and transport equipment increased over 6%, which includes electrical items, TVs, dryers, washing machines.

1 July 2010 to 30 June 2011



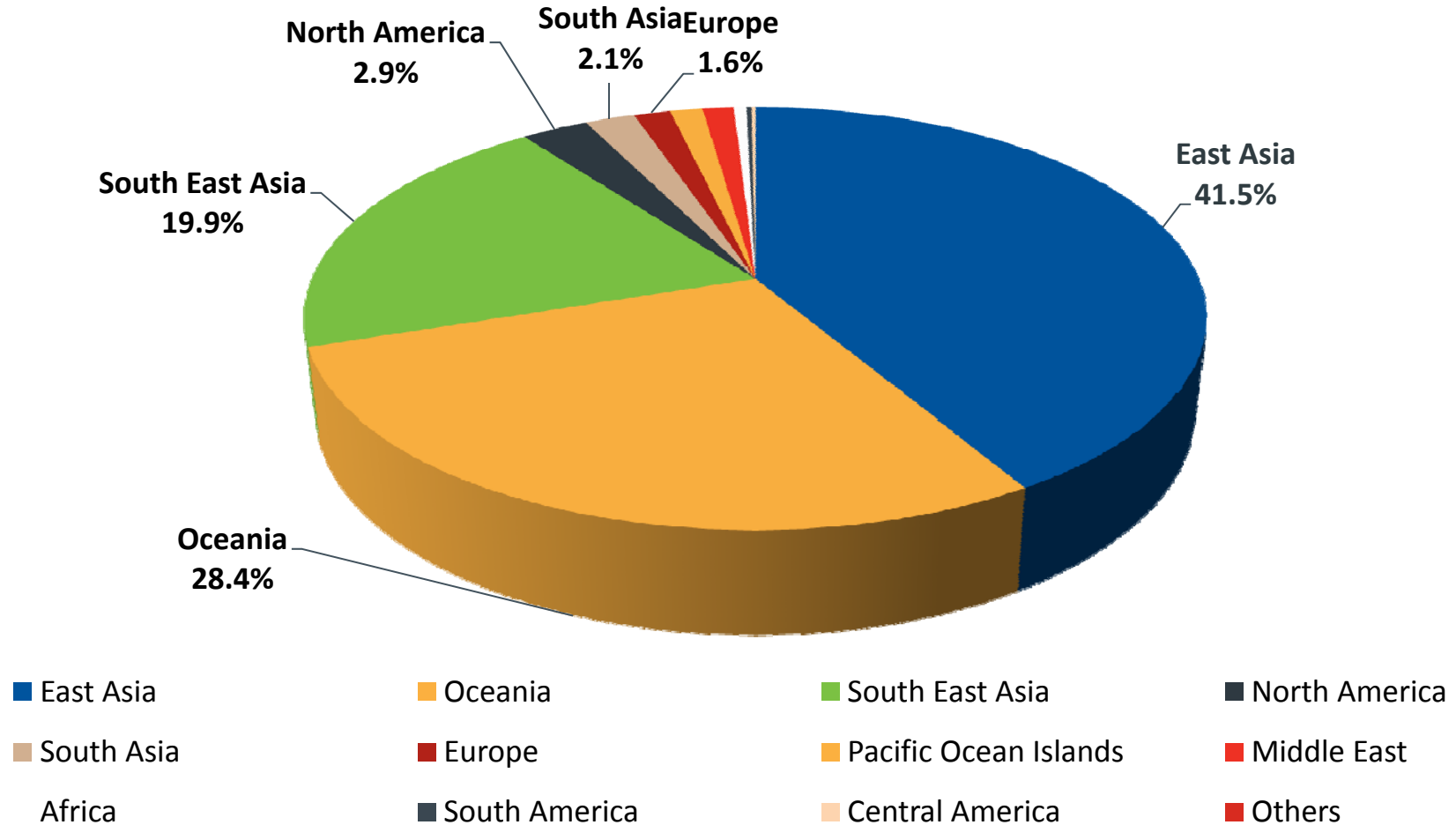
# Full Container Exports by Commodity

- Total full container exports rose by 3.6% when compared to last year reaching 458,700 TEUs.

## Key drivers of growth were:

- Cereals increased over 7%, that includes wheat and flour
- Machinery and transport equipment was up 6% which includes both electrical and non electrical equipment.
- Paper and paper products which includes pulp and waste paper was up 10%.
- Cotton has also increased by 32% against last year
