

INTERMODAL LOGISTICS CENTRE (ILC) AT ENFIELD

RESIDENT UPDATE
October 2011



THE PURPOSE OF THIS RESIDENT UPDATE IS TO PROVIDE ALL INTERESTED COMMUNITY MEMBERS WITH AN OVERVIEW OF THE ILC AT ENFIELD PROJECT AND TO KEEP YOU INFORMED OF CURRENT AND UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES AND WORKS.

BACKGROUND

The Intermodal Logistics Centre (ILC) site at Enfield extends approximately from the intersection of the Hume Highway and Roberts Road, Greenacre in the north, to Punchbowl Road in the south and Cosgrove Road, South Strathfield in the east.

On completion the ILC will include an intermodal terminal, empty container storage facilities, warehousing, a light industrial and commercial area along Cosgrove Road, a new bridge over the existing RailCorp Marshalling Yard, rail connections and an area incorporating ecological and heritage enhancements.

The ILC at Enfield will be part of a network of existing and planned intermodal terminal facilities in Sydney. It will service around a quarter of the total intermodal demand, moving more goods by rail. In doing so, it will mitigate the growth in freight truck numbers on our roads.

EARLY WORKS UPDATE AND TEMPORARY CHANGES TO PARKING ON WENTWORTH STREET

Relocation of water supply pipes in Wentworth Street, Greenacre, will commence in October 2011. This will be followed by pavement tie-ins for kerbs, stormwater works and installation of bridge lights within the designated construction area in Wentworth Street.

Residents and businesses will be notified in advance by the relevant utility provider regarding any temporary services outages which may be required as part of the works. During the works in Wentworth Street traffic management and signage will be in place.

Traffic barriers erected along part of Wentworth Street will remain until approximately December 2011 to allow completion of the services relocations. During this time, public parking will not be permitted in the designated construction area.

MAIN CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Leighton Contractors has been awarded the contract to undertake the 'Main Construction' phase of the ILC at Enfield. Main construction works commenced in July 2011 and are expected to take approximately two years to complete.

The main construction phase of the project includes the delivery of:

- Infrastructure associated with storage warehouses and the Empty Container Storage areas including earthworks, retaining walls, drainage, noise walls and services;
- Infrastructure associated with the Intermodal Terminal, the internal rail siding and through lines including earthworks, pavement, track work and signalling, retaining walls, drainage and service;
- Internal roads;
- Earthworks for the Light Industrial/Commercial Area along Cosgrove Road;
- Works associated with the reconfiguration of the intersection of Roberts Road and Norfolk Road, including a new slip lane;
- Utility connections including works to connect the ILC site to the Ausgrid electrical substation in Hillcrest Avenue, Strathfield South.

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CURRENT CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Construction activities currently underway or to be commenced during October 2011 include:

- Investigations for future utility works on Cosgrove Road and through selected local streets to the Enfield electrical substation will continue;
- Bulk earthworks, drainage works and retaining wall construction at several locations across the ILC site will continue. All earthworks and remediation are carried out in accordance with Occupational Health and Safety standards.
- Out of hours construction activities during weekend possession of the main freight line will be undertaken. Further details to be provided in future Resident Updates;
- Utility works on Cosgrove Rd and through selected local streets to the Enfield electrical substation will commence;
- Noise wall foundation works adjacent to Roberts Rd at the northern end of the site will continue;
- Bulk earthworks, drainage works and retaining wall construction at several locations across the site will continue.

UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

We will continue to inform and notify you of upcoming works. Some of the works planned for the near future include:

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- Northern rail connection works near Roberts Road, including site establishment, service investigations and earthworks will commence;
- Southern rail connection works including site establishment, earthworks, services investigation and geotechnical investigations will commence;
- Earthworks and compaction activities for the empty container storage areas at the southern end of the site will commence;
- Drainage works on Cosgrove Road near the southern end of the site will be undertaken. During these works there may be some minor disruption to traffic. Traffic controls will be in place to manage any impacts on traffic caused by these works;
- Noise wall foundation works adjacent to Roberts Rd at the northern end of the site will commence;
- Bulk earthworks, drainage works and retaining wall construction at several locations across the site will continue.

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- Northern rail connection works near Roberts Road, including earthworks will continue;
- Southern rail connection works including earthworks, will continue;

ENVIRONMENT UPDATE

Leighton Contractors continue to implement environmental management controls at the site in accordance with the approved Construction Environmental Management Plan and the Project Approval. Some of these controls include:

- Dust management controls including the slowing or ceasing of works that may generate dust on dry and windy days and continued use of water carts.
- Monitoring of dust and noise continues in accordance with the Project Approval. No project related dust and noise issues have been recorded to date.
- Erosion and sediment controls are inspected and maintained to prevent sediment and turbid water contributions to receiving waters.
- Frog survey clearances continue in accordance with frog protection management documentation prepared under the Project Approval.
